Together with the Lung Ambition Alliance and AstraZeneca Canada, we are excited to announce the winners of the 2023 Lung Ambition Awards. Congratulations to Dr. Anna L. McGuire (Vancouver General Hospital) and Dr. Alison Wallace (Dalhousie University)!

This Canadian-based lung cancer research awards program is designed to address key gaps in lung cancer care, drive meaningful improvements to patient pathways and improve the lives of those living with lung cancer.

A total of 33 submissions were reviewed and adjudicated by Lung Cancer Canada's Research Committee. "We know research – and especially research with the potential to improve patient outcomes – is a priority for our community and we are thrilled to support these projects and the women who are leading them," Dr. Stephanie Snow, medical oncologist and President of Lung Cancer Canada.

To support the awards, AstraZeneca Canada has committed \$100,000 per year for three years.

The goal of the GOMRG program is to provide a mechanism for scientists to study innovations and accelerate the application of new knowledge relating to the early detection of lung cancer and the etiology of lung cancer in different demographics and populations.
